The D.A.V Group of Schools, Chennai, is an embodiment of Dayanand Anglo-Vedic movement that began in 1886. It was inspired by Swami Dayanand Saraswathi, the founder of Arya Samaj with the aim of building a knowledge-driven society based on Vedic Principles. The seeds of the D A V Group of Schools were sown in Chennai in the year 1970 by dedicated visionaries under the auspices of Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society (TNAES), with a vision to provide, affordable, value based, quality education.

The schools believe in the Vedic Way of Life i.e. the Practice of Pancha Maha Yajna as prescribed in the Vedas.

The Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society, registered under the Societies Act is managing the D A V Group of Schools.

The Society runs 5 full-fledged Senior Secondary Schools affiliated to the C B S E, New Delhi and one Higher Secondary School at Gill Nagar, recognized by the Tamil Nadu State Board in Chennai.

The Society governs two Government aided schools and One Vocational Training Centre in Chennai. The DAV School at Puducherry was started in 2017 and is growing every year.



The recent addition to the D A V family is the school at Pallikaranai, with strength of about 2500 in the year of inception (2022). The Society also manages three schools for BHEL, one at Ranipet and two at Tiruchirappalli and two private S.M.Fomra and DAV Sarada Eashwar Vidyalaya. With 50-years of legacy and experience, the group of schools has continued to burgeon and impart highest levels of moral excellence, which stand as a testimony for the perseverance by teachers and students alike.

Upholding the standards set by the past academicians, the institution continues to provide high quality, affordable and value-based education.

Keeping in line with the values and compassion of the visionaries who started the school, the Board of Management consistently handholds for various endeavours with other schools, as academic associates.

We have 11 Associate Schools with whom we have partnered for the betterment of teaching and learning as a community. To inculcate in children a sense of gratitude, compassion and empathy, the Sushrusha programme was introduced.



Students are given an opportunity to interact with children with special needs, residents of homes for senior citizens and serve them with a sense of humility. They are also helped to visit and take care of animals at Animal Care homes, Goshalas, Farms and also experience the significance of dignity of labour.

The school organizes Career Counselling Programmes for students of classes VIII to XII. Eminent people from relevant industries and distinguished alumni are invited to address the students. D A V . The programme is held online, every first and third Saturday for both D A V and non students.

Students are encouraged to enroll for the program at no additional cost and benefit from the same.

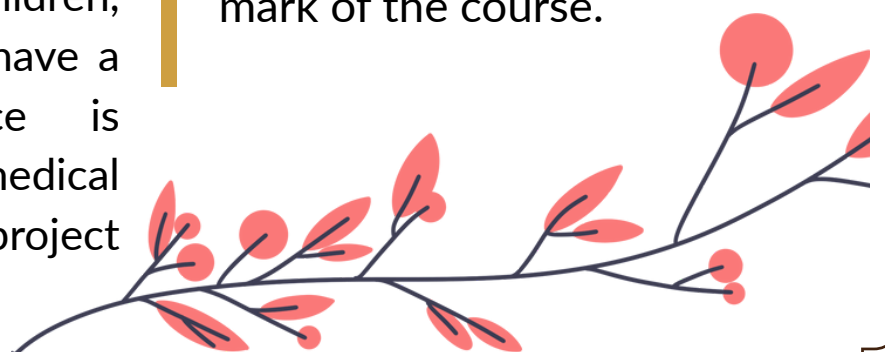

Sri Sarada Eashwar Vidya Mandir Matriculation Higher Secondary School (SSEVM), the brain child of Shri.P.E.Subramaniam, Managing Trustee of PES Charitable Trust, a philanthropist in the true spirit of the word, was established in June 1998 with the blessings of His Holiness Poojyasri Sankaracharya Swamigal of Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam. The trust is now managed by Shri.P.E.Subramaniam, Shri. P.S.Jagdish and Shri.P.S.Shekar.

The school that made its humble beginning with 9 boys, 8 girls and 3 teachers has now grown to an institution with 245 boys, 232 girls and 28 teachers in its family, with classes from Pre-KG to Class XII. The team of far-sighted advisors, dedicated faculty, and enthusiastic and supportive parents work with passion and zeal to help impart quality education to its energetic, with good values.

The team believes in holistic development of individuals. Hence, the institution provides ample opportunities to students to be a participant in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. To further strengthen the different aspects of school education SSEVM has partnered with the DAV Group of Schools, Chennai, who have been in the education space for more than five decades.

The school is now affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) which has been the dream of many parents whose wards are enrolled here.



INDEPENDENCE DAY ADDRESS



Namaste! Greetings to all on this special occasion of the 76th Republic Day of Bharat. Before reflecting on some key milestones between the last Republic Day and today, and focusing on one significant facet—the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (more on that shortly), let us briefly revisit three key points from last year’s address:

1. We celebrated the historic inauguration of the Ram Mandir at Ayodhya, a profound symbol of Dharma and the timeless values embodied by Shri Ram.
2. We highlighted our rich democratic heritage, deeply rooted in ancient traditions and upheld by a Constitution that mirrors the evolving will of the people.

3. We emphasized the sacred duty of voting in the General Elections as a Yajna of nation-building, urging citizens to rise above divisive politics and vote with integrity. In 2024, while voters in over 60 countries—representing nearly half of the world’s population—headed to the polls and largely ousted incumbents, Bharat, our India, defied this trend as the people delivered a mandate in favor of the incumbent alliance, reaffirming trust and ensuring stability and continuity in governance. While peace has devastatingly eluded many parts of the world over the past 12 months, with major conflicts like Ukraine-Russia and Palestine-Israel, it has punctuated both the India-China relationship, through “a broad consensus to restore the ground situation in certain areas along the LAC,”¹ and democracy in Jammu and Kashmir, marked by a historic “35-year-high voter turnout”² in the Lok Sabha elections and a “meteoric 63.88% voter turnout”;² in the Assembly elections.

Organized stone-pelting incidents and hartals, which numbered 1,328 and 52 respectively in 2018, have fallen to an astounding zero—yes, zero—as of July 2024.

4.Stability in governance and peace in key frontiers in Bharat coexisted with several firsts and meaningful, record-setting upward trajectories across the nation. For instance, between the last Republic Day and today, India achieved Universal Electrification with energy shortages at the national level reduced to just 0.1% in FY 2024-25. Significant strides towards Atmanirbharta (Self-reliance) are reflected in record defense production, with the highest-ever growth in indigenous defense production in value terms during the Financial Year (FY) 2023-24, which also saw a record 32.5% increase in defense exports over the previous fiscal year

5.Bharat's National Highway network grew by 60%

6.India added 27 GW of renewable Energy capacity during the calendar year 2024.

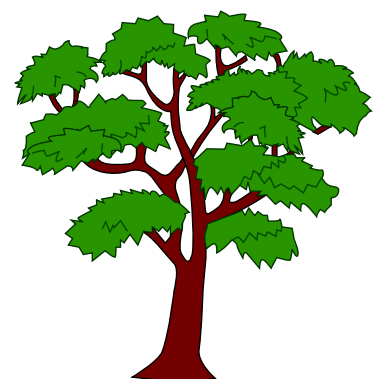
7.Bharat unveiled her first indigenously built Fuel Cell, the "Catamaran"

8.India's Gukesh Dommaraju became the youngest undisputed World Chess

Champion; Bharatiyas shone on the global stage with a historic medal haul at the Paris Paralympics 2024;

9.Indian scientists developed a non invasive blood test for early breast cancer detection, created a rapid test for sickle cell anaemia.

10.Among other achievements. Now, to the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS henceforth). Implemented in 2024, along with the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, the BNS replaces the colonial-era;Indian Penal Code (IPC) of 1860, marking a shift from colonial control to a justice-focused system (Nyaya) and from punitive measures to reformation, rehabilitation, and community service for minor offenses, aligning with contemporary Indian values and ethos. Emphasizing Bharatiya, reflects cultural pride and laws crafted by Indians for Indians. The BNS "provides the following mechanisms for quick justice delivery:



1. **Faster and Fair Resolution:** The new laws promise a faster and fair resolution of cases, instilling confidence in the legal system. Crucial stages of investigation and trial are to be completed within a stipulated time period preliminary enquiry (to be completed in 14 days), further investigation (to be completed in 90 days), supply of document to the victim and accused (within 14 days), commitment of a case for trial (within 90 days), filing of discharge applications (within 60 days), framing of charges (within 60 days). pronouncement of judgement (within 45 days) and filing of mercy petitions (30days before).

2. **Fast-Track Investigations:** The new laws have prioritized the investigations for offences against women and children, ensuring timely completion within 2 months of recording of the information.

3. **Limited Adjournments:** Courts can grant a maximum of two adjournments, to avoid unnecessary delays in case hearings, with a view to ensure timely justice delivery.”¹¹ “Before the three laws were brought into effect from 1st July, 2024, a series of conferences on India Progressive Path in the Administration of Criminal Justice System’ were organised for all the stakeholders..takeholders...These conferences made significant contributions not only in sensitising the stakeholders but

also creating an atmosphere of awareness among the citizens who are ultimate end users of these new laws making the implementation seamless.”

Let me close this address by recalling the Hon’ble Prime Minister’s words about what constitutes the core principle of the “The core principle of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita is;Citizen First!; This law is becoming the protector of civil rights, the foundation of ease of justice.... Another aspect of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita is its humanity and sensitivity. The accused can no longer be kept in jail for a prolonged period without punishment. ... For minor offenses, there is a provision for mandatory bail. Additionally, for minor crimes, community service is offered as an alternative to punishment.”¹³ UNQUOTE With those words of the Hon’ble Prime Minister, join me in completing this speech by repeating after me: JAI HIND, Bharat Mata Ki Jai!

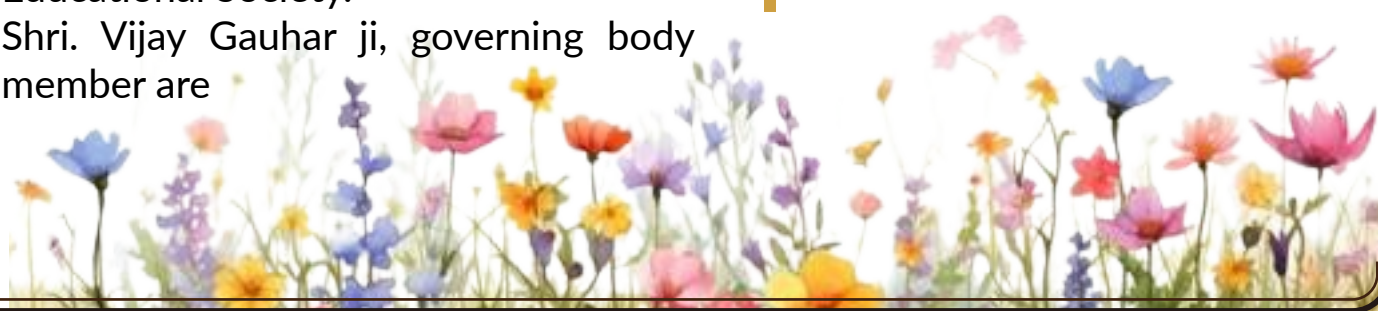

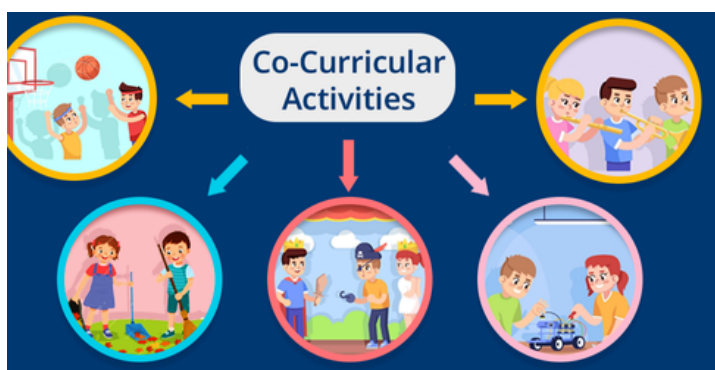

•International Yoga Day was celebrated and the students attempted as an effort to get place in Limca book of records and we accomplished it.

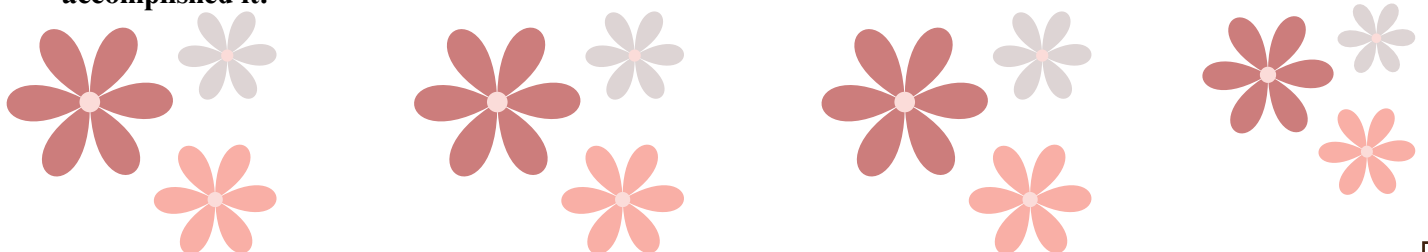
•In Inter DAV Competitions our school participated in Yoga, Basketball, Throwball .

Under the smart class project, we have converted all our classes into digital smart class.

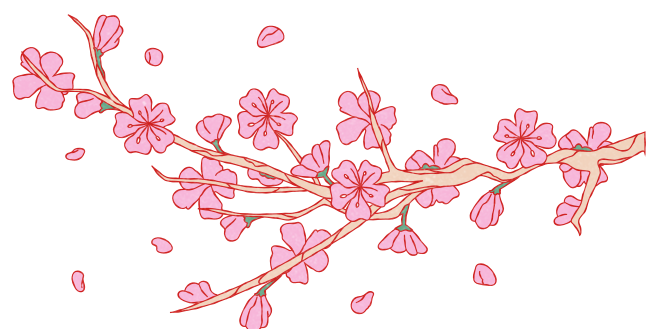
As a cherry on the cake, we have a green environment and students are actively participating in gardening under the "Go Green " project.

Students don't need information—they need relevance, connection, and the freedom to ask questions. And I've discovered that teaching is not about being a know-it-all, but being a learn-it-all.

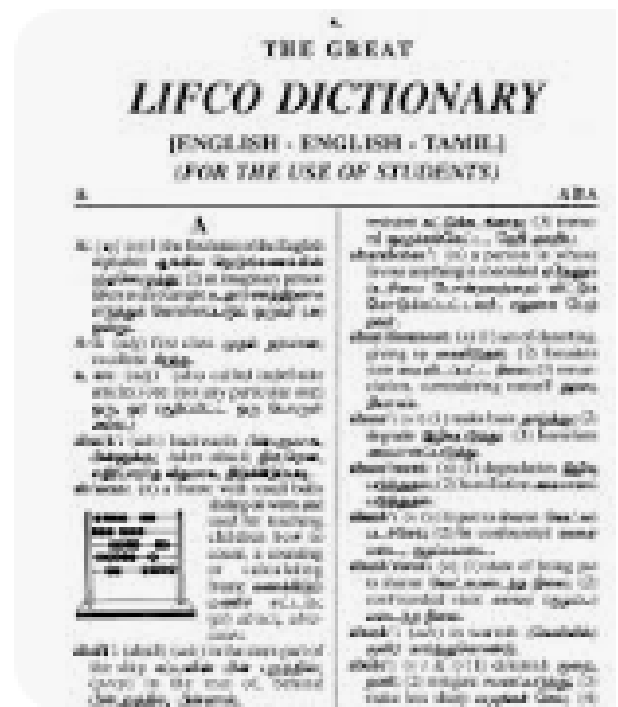
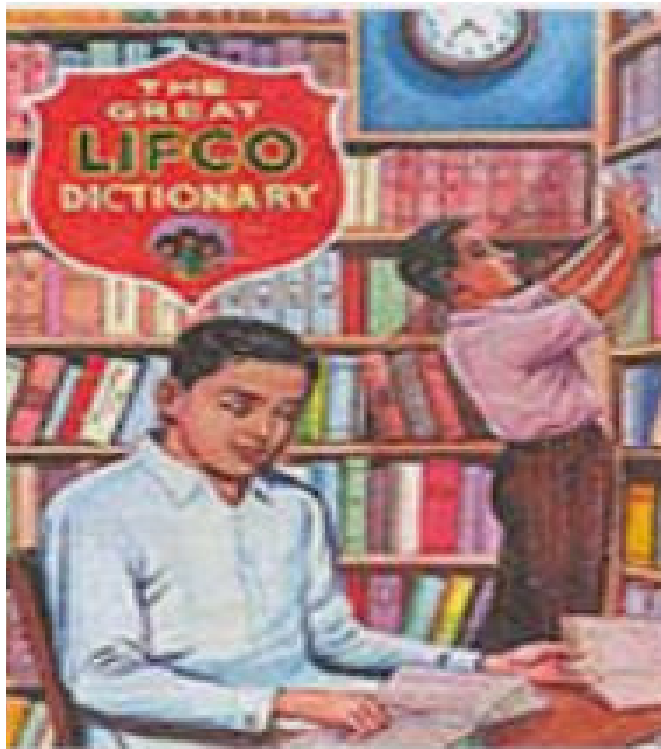

PULWAMA ATTACK

On February 14, 2019, a terror attack was carried out in Pulwama in Jammu and Kashmir by a suicide bomber resulting in the death of 40 CRPF personnel. The suicide bomber, identified as Jaish-e-Mohammad's Adil Ahmed Dar, rammed his vehicle into a bus with the CRPF convoy. World body United Nations and countries from across the globe, including the U.S., Russia, Australia, France, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh, have condemned the brutal Pulwama terror attack, and extended their support to India in the fight against terrorism.

Kashmir is a disputed territory, claimed both by India and Pakistan with both countries administering part of the territory.¹ Pakistan has sought to gain control of Indian-administered Kashmir. An insurgency began to proliferate in Indian-administered Kashmir in the late 1980s. Pakistan provided the insurgency with material support. Since 1989, about 70,000 people have been killed in the uprising and the Indian crackdown. According to Time, unrest in Kashmir grew in 2016 after India killed a popular militant leader, Burhan Wani. A rising number of young locals from Indian administered Kashmir have joined the militancy.¹ Many sources state that the majority of militants in Kashmir are now local, not foreign. In 2018 alone, the death toll included 260 militants, 160 civilians and 150 government forces.
