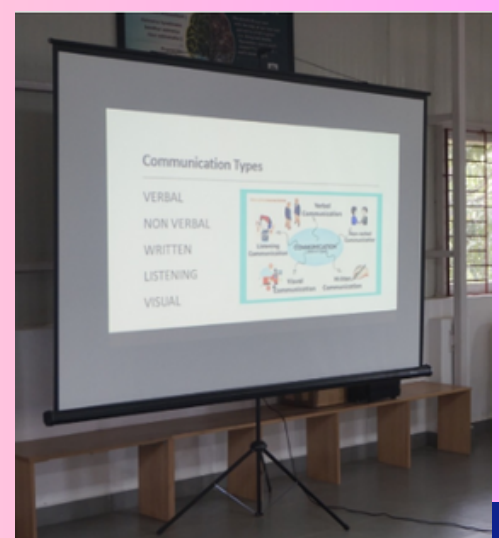

By morning, the careless were turned away. Not for lack of skill — but for lack of humility. They hadn't failed a trial of ability, but one of character.

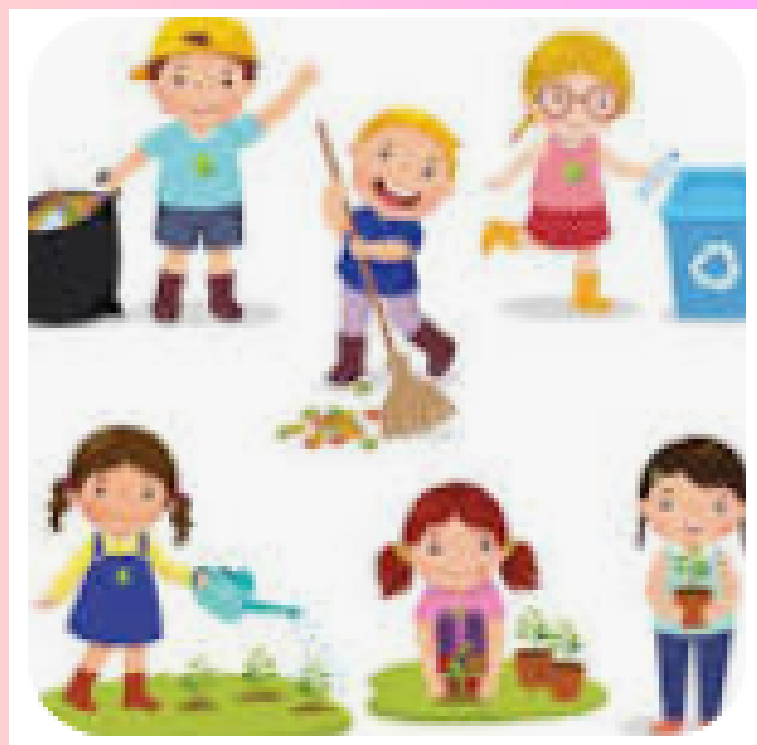
SPOTLIGHT ON CLEANLINESS

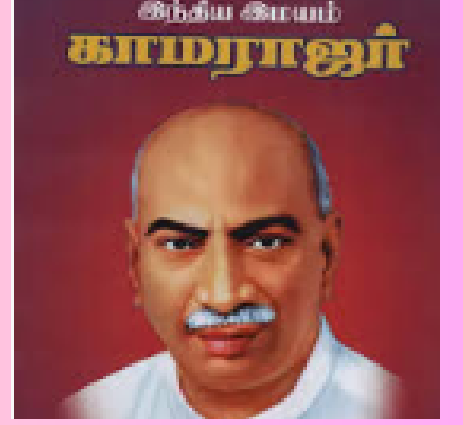

"The price of victory is high, but so is the reward of freedom."

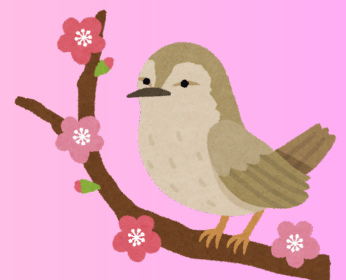
This inspirational message reminded everyone of the immense bravery and dedication of the Indian armed forces during the Kargil War.

- **Learning outcome : it was a truly enriching and heartwarming experience. The visit offered deep insight into the importance of cow protection and sustainable, compassionate living.**

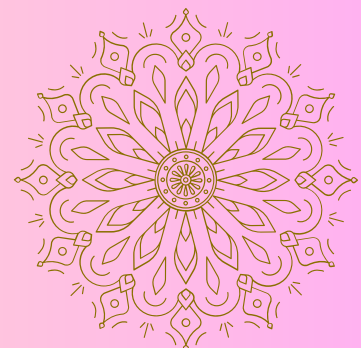
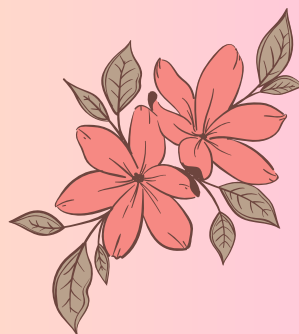
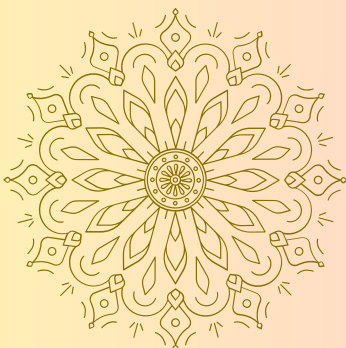


Seva Maithri Club -2025-2026

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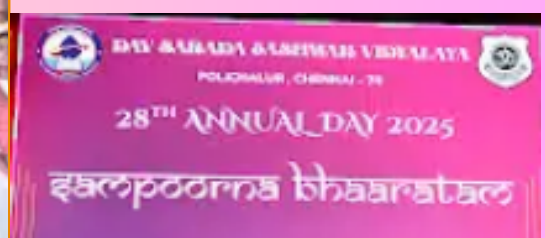
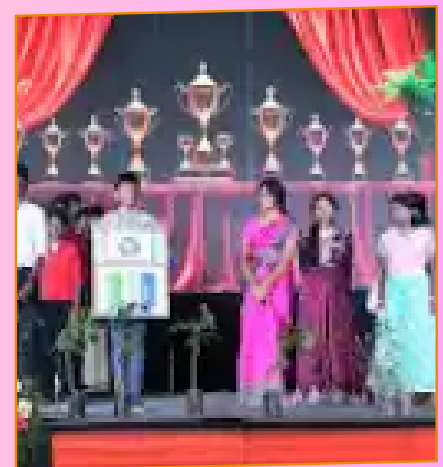

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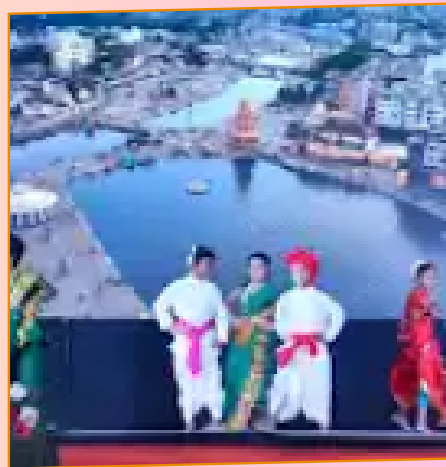
